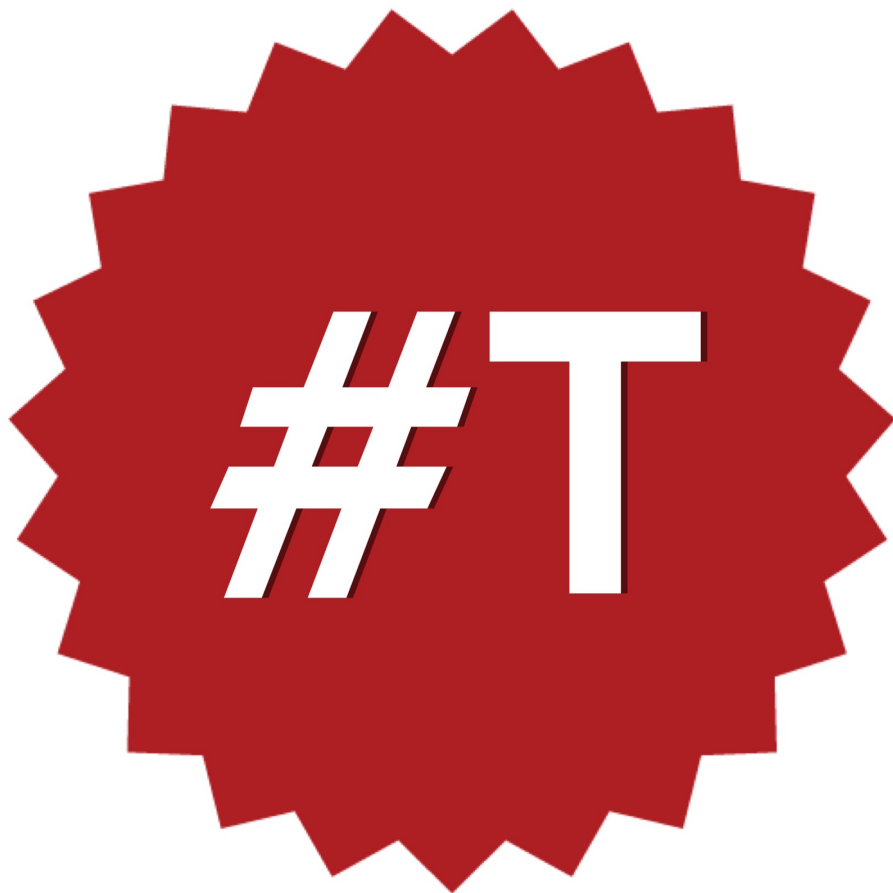

JUSTICE FOR ALL

Thirty-six years ago, the citizens, wishing to establish justice, gave unto us a written Constitution that would guarantee a democratic coexistence in accordance with a fair economic and social order. This was announced in the first words of that Constitution and still can be read in its preamble.

Well, thirty- six years have gone by since we, as citizens, gave that rule unto ourselves, and all those wishes are in the process of becoming inhibited thanks to laws and unjust policies that have led this country towards the economic and especially moral collapse we suffer today.

INDEPENDENCE OF COURTS

A manifesto for Justice

The Justice that our Constitution wished to establish, administered by independent judges to citizens who are equal before the law, is agonizing today between laws and bills that affect access to justice as they make it subject to payment of dissuasive economic amounts (court fees) or undermine the independence of our courts.

The lack of attention paid to justice and the attempts to manage it with self-serving one-sided criteria have also caused that just very few resources have been allocated to improve its performance, so today the first of the reasons why we were given this constitution is virtually at a standstill.

Don't let them deceive you: The collapse of Justice has allowed corruption to take hold in the public institutions and it is this public corruption that has led to the economic and moral collapse we suffer today.

Does anyone doubt that, if the minimum judicial means had been allocated to control financial, estate and urban abuse and corruption, this economic crisis would not be so severe now? Does anyone doubt that, if there had been a quick and effective justice the embarrassing performances offered to us by the political class and the highest institutions of the nation in endless corruption proceedings would not have occurred?

Does anyone doubt, that without an administration of Justice that protects and defends the rights of citizens these rights are

nothing more than worthless scraps of paper?

You should all know and bear this in mind: If Justice does not exist there is no point in proclaiming and affirming rights because no one will be able to claim them; if Justice does not work properly no right or law which is enacted will be effective, if access to justice is subject to a price, the exercise of its rights will also be subject to a price.

No coexistence is possible without justice, all states are failed states without it; It is time, therefore, to remember why and what for we decided to live together and why and what for we were given a constitution. It is time to regenerate and rebuild the coexistence and there is no other way for that than to start with the principles.

For this reason thousands of citizens have come together under a single letter: a #T representing our demand for Justice, #T representing our rejection of the dreadful court fees imposed by the government, a #T evoking the equal scale of justice, #T reminding us that justice and coexistence is for the #Totality of the population and is not owned by a few.

There are no political colors under the shadow of #T, as the need for justice is common to all present and future parties,

states and any community that aspires to be minimally democratic.

This democratic coexistence is impossible without justice and what arises from there is the urgent need to recover it, because if the ongoing destruction of justice is completed, all hope to cohabitate in democracy and freedom will have evaporated.

In #T we will fight for justice using the few but decisive weapons that we have: our voice and our vote. We will demand the immediate withdrawal of the infamous law on court fees, we will demand that the necessary resources are allocated to the administration of justice to make it work, we will claim free and decent justice and we will call upon the government to reform the laws and bills that threaten judicial independence. We will ,in short, fight and win this battle, because it is prior to any other political discussion no matter how important that might be; because without justice there is no coexistence.

So when you vote do not forget that there is something more important than the decision to vote for a party or another, and that is voting for parties that do not support the abject law on court fees, for example; because first of all we need to finish with corruption, we need to make sure that no more economic and moral collapses as the ones we are going through now can exist, because what we need is justice for all and from all.

Yes, just as it sounds, from all and for all.
